- Positive Behavioral Supports – Positive supports are approaches that offer respectful, supportive, and effective ways to help people make positive changes in their lives. Positive supports are used to build on a person's successes, strengths, and desires, and do not include the use of punishment.

FINANCIAL RESOURCES

Financial supports for eligible adults with disabilities. Includes information about food & nutrition assistance, housing, general income assistance and disability related funding sources.

FOOD & NUTRITION ASSISTANCE

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) – SNAP helps Minnesotans with low incomes get the food they need for sound nutrition and well-balanced meals. Approved participants get a debit card to use to buy food at many stores and farmers markets. - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – Employment & Training Program (SNAP – E&T) – The SNAP E&T program is designed to help people prepare for and become employed. Participants receive services from an employment services provider in their area. <https://mn.gov/dhs/people-we-serve/children-and-families/economic-assistance/food-nutrition/programs-and-services/e-and-t.jsp>
- Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP) – MFIP helps families with children meet their basic needs, while helping parents create financial stability through work. - Minnesota Food Assistance Program (MFAP) – MFAP provides state-funded food assistance to legal noncitizens age 50 or older who do not qualify for SNAP because of their citizenship status. Benefits for the MFAP are the same as SNAP. HOUSING

- Minnesota Supplemental Aid Housing Assistance (MSA) – MSA Housing Assistance helps people with disabilities who pay more than 40 percent of their income toward housing costs so that they have a choice about where they live.

Services may provide supports for GRH recipients that pay for housing expenses like rent, food and household supplies.

GENERAL INCOME ASSISTANCE

- General Assistance (GA) – This program helps people without children pay for basic needs, such as rent and clothing. It provides money to people who can't work enough to support themselves, and whose income and resources are very low. People who get GA are also eligible for help with medical and food costs through Medical Assistance and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
